LIST OF SOCIOLOGY COURSES FOR B A PROGRAM LEARNING OUTCOMES

BASOS101: FUNDAMENTAL OF SOCIOLOGY – I SEMESTER

- 1. This course is a broad introduction to the discipline of sociology. It familiarizes the students with the history and some of the fundamental concepts and concerns of the discipline.
- 2. To understand the basic concepts in sociology and their fundament theoretical interrelations, such that students will be able to difine.

BASOS201: SOCIAL INSTITUTIONS AND CHANGE - II SEMESTER

- 1. This course provides conceptual and theoretical understanding of social change and development as it has emerged is sociological literature.
- 2. To address in particular the Indian experience of social change and development.
- 3. Show how institutions interconnect in their effects on each other and on individuals.
- 4. Demonstrate how social change affects social structure and individual and show how structure is constantly in a process of becoming.

BASOS301: STUDY OF INDIAN SOCIAL THOUGHT- III SEMESTER.

- 1. This course exposes the students to the contribution of sociologists who have built-up sociology in India.
- 2. This course provide conceptual analyze contemporary sociological theories.

BASOS401: STUDY OF WESTERN SOCIAL THOUGHT-IV SEMESTER.

- 1. Define theory and describe and illustrate its role in building sociological knowledge.
- 2. Compare and contrast basic theoretical orientations in reference to social phenomena.
- 3. Understand and show how theories reflect the historical and social contexts of the times and cultures in which they were developed.

BASOS501: STUDY OF INDIAN SOCIETY-V SEMESTER

- 1. This course gives them insights about the social change in India
- 2. Trace the origin and evolution of the structure of Indian society.

3. Illustrate the influence of social movements on the emergence of the contemporary structures in society.

BASOS502: SOCIAL MOVEMENTS IN INDIA-V SEMESTER

- 1. This course illustrates certain significant social movements in India, stretching from pre-colonial to contemporary period.
- 2. It gives critically evaluate these theories and perspectives by investigating historical and contemporary examples of protests.

BASOS601: RESEARCH METHODOLOGY-VI SEMESTER

- 1. Apply a range of research methods to investigate research questions of choice.
- 2. Use statistical techniques and tools appropriate for such research.
- 3. Understand ethical codes that govern the conduct of sociologists and how sociological knowledge may be applied to people and lives.

BASOS602: SOCIAL PROBLEMS IN INDIA- VI SEMESTER

- 1. Understand the structural issues within which Indian social concerns are embedded
- 2. Appreciate social issues from a development perspective.

BASOS607: PROJECT WORK -VI SEMESTER

- 1. Students will acquire the ability to make links across different areas of knowledge and to generate, develop and evaluate ideas and information so as to apply these skills to the project task.
- 2. Students will acquire the skills to communicate effectively and to present ideas clearly and coherently to specific audience in both the written and oral forms.
